

# Collegiate High School

## Home learning policy

At Collegiate High School we want to encourage pupils to develop the skills to be able to work independently in Key stage 3 and 4 and also beyond school. We thus want our younger pupils to want to work at home on tasks that may consolidate, extend or even just be fun to do. We also want to avoid Home Learning being a source of conflict and negativity in the classroom

### Key Stage 3

- √ Our pupils will be encouraged to complete Home Learning tasks. Those pupils that do will be praised and their efforts recorded and discussed at Review Days.
- √ Pupils who do not complete Home Learning tasks will not be questioned or punished in class, but this fact will be recorded and discussed at Review Day.
- √ A Home Learning programme will be produced by the year PAL and be sent out to parents and published on the school website.
- √ Most Home Learning tasks will be on Fronter and all pupils will be given a Fronter password and be shown how to use the Home Learning section of Fronter.
- √ Pupils with limited PC/internet access will also be given a hard copy of the Home Learning task.
- √ There will be a Home Learning link on the school's website.
- √ Some Home Learning tasks in some subjects may also be formal written tasks that form part of the subject's assessment schedule and will need to be completed by all pupils and returned to school by an agreed date.
- √ Parents will be encouraged to look at the Home Learning section of Fronter and also take an interest in what their children are doing.

## Key Stage 4

- √ Home learning at Key Stage 4 is viewed as an integral and essential part of the curriculum. Independent learning outside of school hours is vital if pupils are going to reach their full potential.
- √ A Home Learning programme will be produced by the year PAL and be sent out to parents and published on the school website.
- √ Pupils will be encouraged to use a Learning Planner to record their Home learning tasks.
- √ Home learning may be used to consolidate or extend their school work. In many cases Home Learning tasks will count towards their final grade.
- √ Home Learning tasks may be posted on Fronter or be hard copy written tasks.
- √ Parents will be informed if pupils are not completing Home Learning tasks and this will also be discussed at Review Day.
- √ Parents are encouraged to contact school if their child is not engaged in Home Learning.
