Collegiate High School is changing and constantly improving. The trend in examinations results is upwards and recent results have put Collegiate in the top 10% of schools in the country for the progress students make from when they join until they leave.

We aim to offer the best possible education. We value students as individuals, and feel that each student should have every opportunity to develop in a safe environment.

Curriculum

In Key Stage 3 (Years 7 - 9), all students follow the National Curriculum in the core subjects of English, Maths, Science and Information Communication Technology. Students also study PE, Technology, French, Art, Music, Drama, History, Geography, RE, Citizenship and Social Education. Many students will follow courses which give them GCSE examination success during Year 9. In addition to this we ensure that students in Key Stage 3 have extended time with their form tutors to provide care guidance and support. Wherever possible, form tutors will remain with the tutor group throughout their time at Collegiate.

Key Stage 4

The Key Stage 4 curriculum leads to GCSE, BTEC and other qualifications. Some of the recently introduced courses have a vocational bias, preparing students for the world of work. Links with Blackpool Sixth Form College and Blackpool and the Fylde College are very good, with a large number of students going on to study advanced courses after leaving school. Other qualifications, such as the Junior Sports Leadership Award, further broaden the range of experience available to students, and support our commitment to work with the local community.

Careers advice and guidance are provided by specialist staff. Students undertake a period of Work Experience during their final two years.

Homework

To support work in classes and in the preparation of examinations, additional work at home is expected of all students. Students are helped in the organisation of work with the use of their own Collegiate learning log.





Special Needs Students

We take special care of students with special educational needs. Visiting inspectors have remarked upon this as a strength within the school.

Gifted and Talented Students

Provision for Gifted and Talented students is made to support their area of strength.

We are keen for our students to be prepared for life outside school. Part of the Government initiative 'Every Child Matters' is the requirement for students to make a positive contribution to society. Collegiate High School has an excellent record of working with the local community and beyond. Students regularly work with our seven Partner Primary Schools as part of our Specialist College commitment. The school has strong links with Highfurlong Special School next door to us, and has worked regularly with Hoyle Resource Centre for the Elderly over the last ten years.

The school has a very proactive Student Council, and values the contribution this can make to the school for all students. This has helped the school hold many successful charity events for local, national, and international appeals. We believe that students should be encouraged to support others and show respect to the whole school community and their environment. We maintain regular contact with parents, as we believe their support and involvement are essential in all areas of school life. We use a range of face to face events for parents to meet teachers as well as more formal reporting processes.

It is the policy of the Trust to grant places in the first instance to those who express a first preference for the school. Parents who would like their children to come to Collegiate should make it their first choice.
